DESCRIPTION

This is a course in "Pony Club" Emergency paediatric first aid and is taught by health care professionals that deal with these equestrian related injuries on a daily basis. The purpose of the qualification is for the learner to attain the knowledge and practical competence required to deal with a range of paediatric first aid situations.

The Pony Clubs risk assessment of First Aid needs identifies that there is a requirement for Emergency First Aid at Work practitioners, then this national Award in Emergency First Aid at Work also satisfies the requirements of the regulatory body for First Aid - the Health and Safety Executive (HSE).

This course is suitable for anyone volunteering within the Pony Club (coaches, officials, supervisors/volunteers and non healthcare professionals) and anyone working with children in the equestrian environment.

COURSE SYLLABUS INCLUDES

A range of subjects is covered including:

- Role of the Paediatric First Aider
- Seizure
- Diabetic emergencies
- Primary survey
- Choking
- Asthma
- Resuscitation (CPR including the safe use of an AED)
- Minor injuries
- Meningitis
- Wounds, bleeding and shock
- Recovery position • Febrile convulsions
- Allergic reactions including anaphylaxis
- Fractures
- Extreme cold and heat
- Head, neck and back injuries
- Foreign bodies
- Electrical incidents

LOCATION

CERTIFICATION

The qualification is assessed both through practical demonstration and written assessment.

A learner must successfully pass both the written and practical assessments to achieve the qualification. There is no grading of the assessment; learners pass or are referred.

The qualification is valid for three years from the date of achievement. It is recommended that the learner attends annual refresher training.

NUMBERS

A maximum of 12 students can be accommodated on this course and all learners MUST be a minimum of 16 years of age. A student cannot assume a responsibility in the workplace until they reach the age of 16, and then it is the employer's responsibility to ensure that the student is suitable for that role. The certificate will expire as dated on the certificate, irrespective of age.

DURATION

Contact hours for direct classroom teaching and assessment must be no less than 16 hours over 2 days. The qualification can be delivered over a maximum of a 6-week period with each training session being a minimum of 2 hours.
